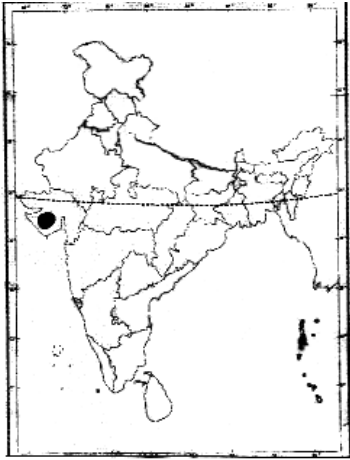

- ◆ **Cyprus issue:** UNO helped cyprus to avert a conflict between Greeks and Turks.
- ◆ **Indonesian problem:** UNO intervened in Kashmir in getting independence to Indonesia from the Dutch.
- ◆ **Kashmir Problem:** UNO intervened in Kashmir problem and averted war between India and Pakistan.
- ◆ **Korean Problem:** UNO stopped the aggression of North Korea over South Korea.
- ◆ **Liberation of Congo:** UNO helped Congo to get liberation from Belgium.
- ◆ **Liberation of Kuwait:** UNO helped Kuwait to liberate from Iraq.
- ◆ **Suez Canal crisis:** UNO succeeded in averting war between England and Egypt over Suez Canal crisis.
- ◆ UNO plays a positive role in avoiding quarrels and helped in preserving peace.

b) Analyse the role of the Indian constitution in social engineering.

A: Social Engineering means application of sociological principles to specific social problems.

- ◆ One important aspect of the social engineering is the problem of the Right of Minorities.
 - ◆ The sad experience of suppression of Jewish minority in Nazi Germany weighed in the minds of the constitution makers.
 - ◆ They decided to give special protection to the minority community.
- So that they don't feel marginalised by the majority.

11. a) What steps have been taken to ensure that any citizen can access information from the different government departments in our country?

- A:
- ◆ Right to Information Act came in to force on 2005, October 13.
 - ◆ All government departments must appoint their Public Information Officer (PIO).
 - ◆ Every PIO should be maintain all records.
 - ◆ Any citizen can ask information from the public authority.
 - ◆ The PIO should give reply within 30 days.
 - ◆ If the citizen do not satisfy he can approach district authorities.
 - ◆ All PIOs are answerable to the State Public Information Officer.
 - ◆ All the SPIOs are answerable to the Central Public Information Officer.

With such steps RTI Act ensure that any citizen can access information from the different government departments in the country.

b) According to you what would be the reason for and against supporting the British in World War – II?

A: During the second world war, there were mixed ideas throughout the nation on matter whether or not to support British in War. They are as follows.

For:

- ◆ To support the Fascism in Italy and Nazism in Germany which were becoming threats to humanity.

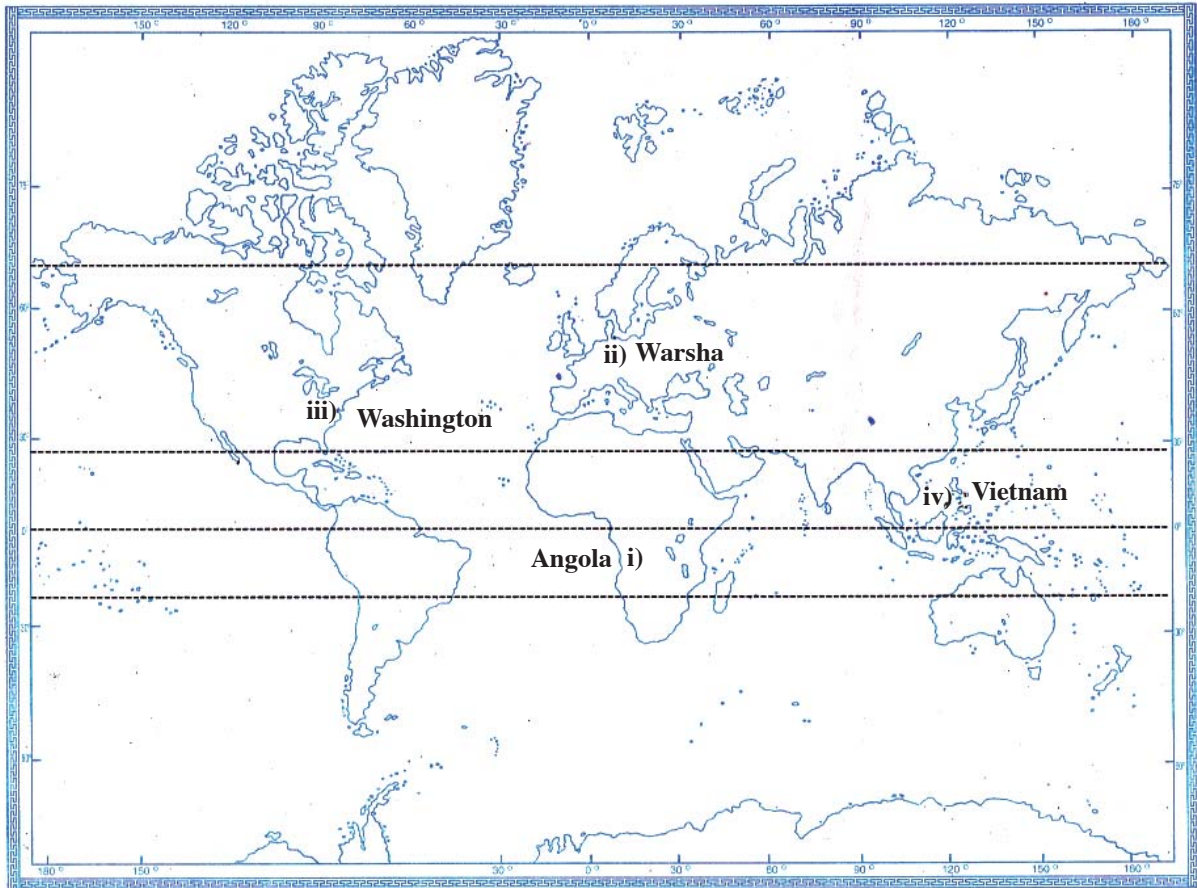

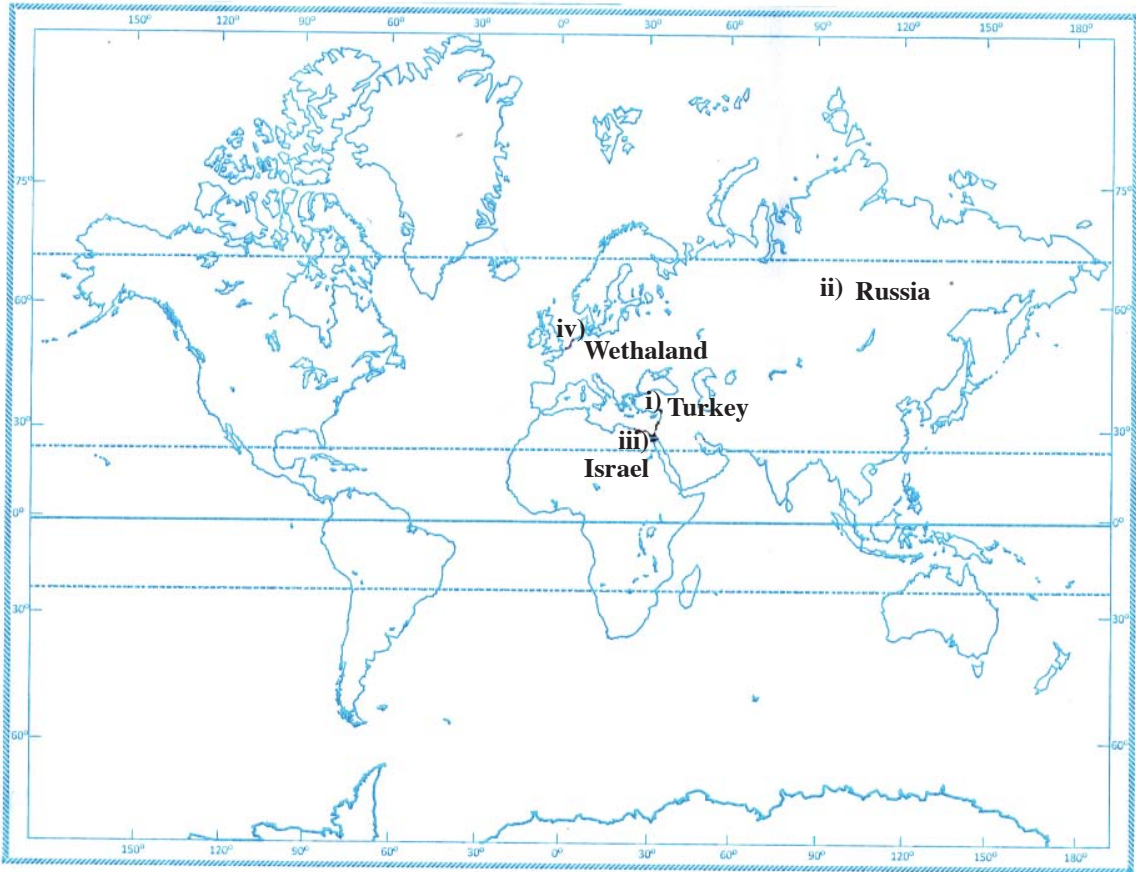
